

MINUTES of meeting of the Program Library  
Sub-committee held on Monday 10th February  
1969 at 3.30 pm in the William Robertson  
Building.

1. APOLOGIES

Dr. Himsworth sent his apologies for being unable to attend the meeting.

2. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

Mr. Kershaw pointed out the comment on program 155 in the appendix to the minutes referred to the presence of the routine in a library and not to the use of this technique within a program.

Matters arising from the minutes:

1. Professor Vandome asked whether any action had been taken on the suggestion that ERCC should keep departmental libraries informed about computer manuals etc. It was pointed out that an Atlas Autocode bibliography (Documentation 68/12) was circulated in December. In general the Centre would prefer users with problems to make personal contact and it was decided that no further action should be taken on this matter.

3. DEMAND FOR LIBRARY PROGRAMS

The librarian reported that the programs most frequently requested were: 1. sort/merge, 2. conversion of input media, 3. general statistical programs (BMD, SSP, nor, simplex), 4. polynomial operations. Half the people who requested programs were not aware of the program catalogue. The program to manipulate the catalogue was now available so that there was scope for wider publicity.

The Centre should arrange to gather information on all program requests, whether or not they could be met.

Mr. Day said that there were misgivings about some of the 360 SSP routines and the Centre intended to rewrite some of them. The committee felt that rewriting should be undertaken only after checking with other British and American 360 Universities. The committee were reminded that a differential equation package is being written in Computer Science.

It is proposed to hold a meeting of survey program users to assess their requirements; the committee shall discuss this area after this general meeting. The Centre shall keep in touch with the survey program working party at London University.

4. ICI PROCEDURE LIBRARY

The committee agreed to ask Dr. Thomas to inform ICI that, at this Centre, they did not think the purchase of the ICI procedure library at a price in the region of £30,000 to be in the Centre's interests, but that if the library could be broken down into smaller packages the Centre may be interested in negotiating for about a quarter or a third of it. Dr. Thomas was to be further asked to communicate this decision to the Computer Board, either directly or via Professor Finney.

5. EFFECT OF 360/50 ON PROGRAM LIBRARY

It was decided to postpone discussion on this item until Mr. P.E. Williams could attend. IBM 360 packages and the implications of joining SHARE would be considered at the next meeting.

6. DATE OF NEXT MEETING

It was agreed to hold the next meeting on Thursday, April 17th 1969 at 3.30 pm.
